

## Church Offices get long overdue renovation

During the period that St. Paul's was '*between ministers*' the property committee seized the opportunity to update both the minister's office and the adjoining general office. The improvement was enormous and was widely hailed as badly needed and 'about time'.

While the minister's office was available for the secretary to use, the renovation of the general office was undertaken. The main items to be renovated were the floor, which was replaced by a red cherry laminate hardwood flooring, new baseboards and cool blue energy efficient lighting. The shelving was removed while the walls were painted and then securely reinstalled.



The major improvement came in the form of a new custom-built workstation, which combines a desk, storage cabinet and accommodation for computer peripherals such as printer, fax machine and monitor. It was custom built to accommodate the secretary's requirements and is designed for ease of use and efficient organization.

Others who performed the actual work were George, Don and Alcia Cooper, a family operation. Members of the finance committee worked tirelessly to sort through countless files, culling out unneeded material and re-organizing the remaining records for easier access. Fay Copland and members of the worship committee contributed similar assistance in reorganizing the files and records in the minister's office.
