

Roy McEwen is a key man in getting things done at St. Paul's

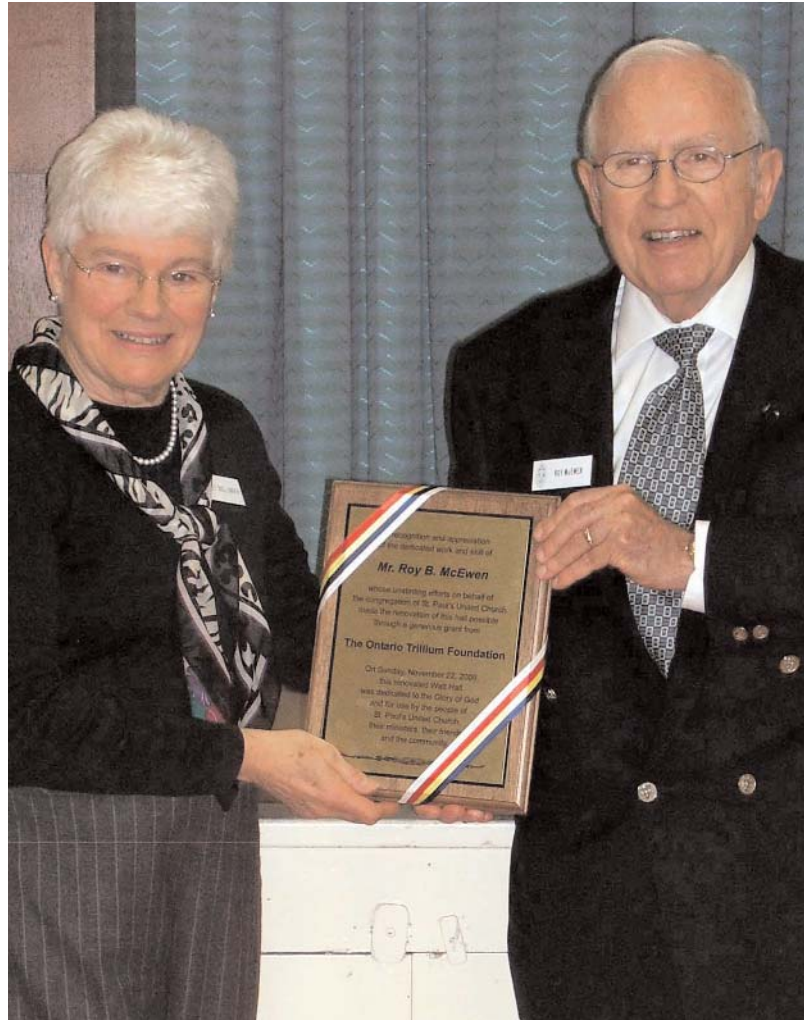
One in a series of articles honouring special people of St. Paul's who have given, and continue to give, extraordinary service on behalf of the congregation.

- * **The financing, repair, paving and marking of our parking lot in the spring of 2009.**
- * **The financing, face-lift and renovation of Watt Hall, our gymnasium and auditorium, just completed in November 2009.**
