CHRISTIAN DEVELOPMENT:

St. Paul's Sunday school is a vibrant, active community where children interact with the stories of the Bible in various ways. Children aged 3 to 4 find a welcome in their 'own' Sunday school room where adult teachers share in story, games and crafts.

Children 5 and older enter into our "Rotational Model of Sunday School" where they interact and study the same Bible story for 6 weeks. Each week the children attend a different station, such as the computer lab, cooking in the kitchen, playing in activities, hearing stories around a campfire or working on a craft.

We make a special time for the children to quiet themselves and do spiritual journaling.

At the end of the six weeks we enjoy a movie and popcorn. The movie will be based upon a subject that we have studied. Children love coming to Sunday school here! Please join us.

'Tots and Us' is an informal play and music time where caregivers and their children are invited to spend some time on Monday mornings from 10 to 11. The program runs from September to May.

NURSERY:

Every Sunday; morning infants and young children up to 3 years of age are welcomed into our bright and cheery nursery. It is supervised by a trained nursery attendant with an adult volunteer and they keep the children comfortable and safe. Many age related toys are available for their amusement.

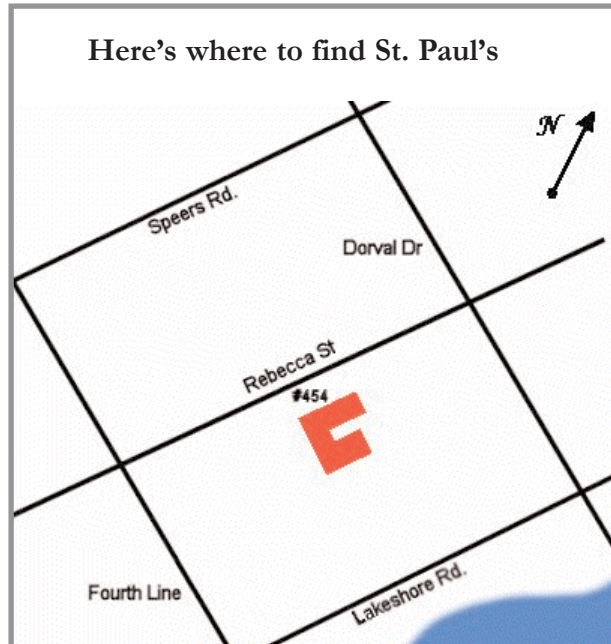

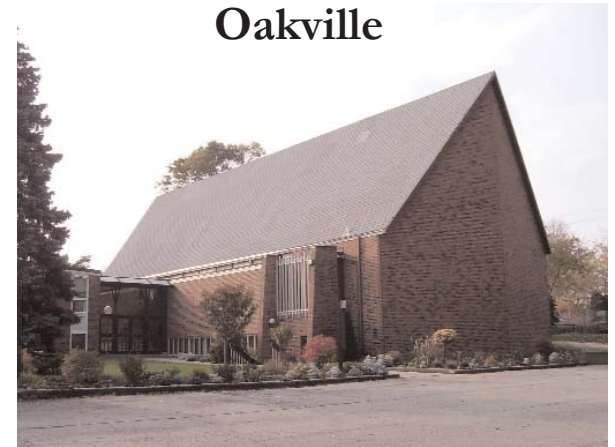

Fully accessible to people with mobility limitations



St. Paul's recently installed a separate entrance in conjunction with a dedicated elevating device to make the facility accessible to people with mobility restrictions.

The west side door is now remotely controlled by push button and four handicapped parking spaces are provided. The 'lift' is located just inside the special entrance. It can accommodate wheelchair and walker users, allowing them access to any level of our church building.

The special entrance is open before, during and following regular Sunday worship services and can be available for other events by prior arrangement.

A special key is required to operate the lift and users must apply for one at the office and also undergo a short training program.

WATT HALL gymnasium / auditorium

Named in honour of our first minister, Rev. George D. Watt, it is a beehive of activity at most times.
